



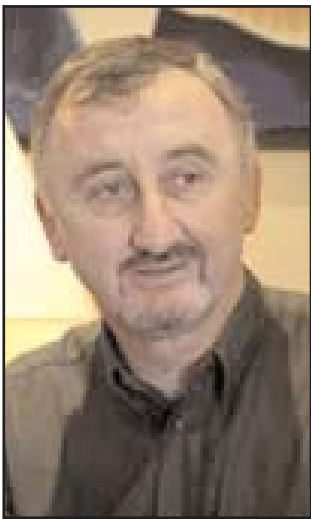

These electronic stores all contain a host of products at extremely competitive prices. Simply tap in your credit or debit card details and you can make instant purchases. How much?

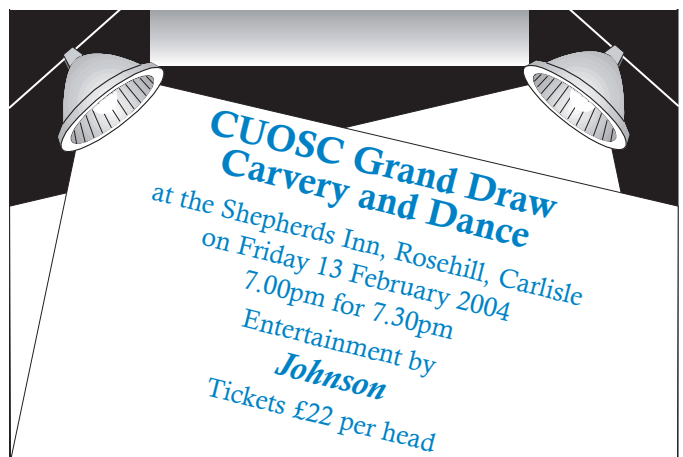

It saddens me to see them bottom of the Third Division and it looks like it's going to be a game to far for them to get out of that position. If they do go into the Conference where could it end? I hope to see better times ahead.

Happy Days in The Paddock

It seems a long time ago now but happy days in the Paddock! Mick Wadsworth was the manager; the team were riding high in the Third Division and a corner to United at the Warwick Road End. Standing next to a barrier and having to lean over it to see the corner being taken, a cross to the head of Dean Walling who pops it into the net. Excitement all round, especially for the fella next to my friend who shouted so loud that his top set of teeth left his mouth at breakneck speed, hit the fella in front on his back and fell to the terraces.

You can imagine the scene; we now have the crowd going daft, one fella on his hands and knees looking for his upper dentures and my friend and I no help at all as we were creased laughing. 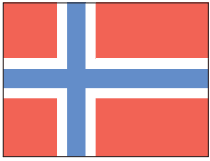

Greetings from Carlisle United Official Supporters Club Scandinavian Branch



THE Carlisle United FC Supporters Club - Scandinavian Branch was born on April 20th 2002. Back then we were just a small group of 5 - 6 Norwegian Carlisle United followers who for quite some time had been thinking of forming a supporters club in honour of Cumbria's number one football club.

You might perhaps ask why a bunch of Norwegian football fans would pick Carlisle United as their team to follow. As of today I'm still not sure I know the correct answer to that question. I'll just give a brief history of how it came to.

It basically dates back to 1997 when my mate Kim-Freddy and I flew over to England for the second leg UEFA Cup tie between Chelsea and Tromso at Stamford Bridge. We flew in a few days early and went to Birmingham to see Aston-Villa face Spanish side Athletic Bilbao. During our Birmingham stay we went to the JJB-Sports store in the city centre to look for bargain football tops. It didn't take long before I stumbled over a blue Eddie Stobart top price tagged at £6.99. (Come to think of it I'd even purchase a Gretna top for £6.99). I picked up the blue bargain top and showed it to my mate. He was well pleased with my find and asked me what team it was. A closer inspection of the badge told me that our newfound club was Carlisle United.

At the time we were quite positive that Carlisle was somewhere on the outskirts of London so we had no hesitation in buying the tops. With Carlisle being a London club we thought it would be easier for us to go see them play during our annual footie trips to England. I asked one of the guys who worked in the store if he knew which division Carlisle was in, but he just shook his head and said he didn't have a clue.

Back at the hotel room we searched for Carlisle on the map and was more than surprised to find that the town was as far away from London as you can get without stepping into Scotland.

After we got back home we wore our tops proudly at footie practice and such and we soon convinced our closest friends to become Carlisle supporters. We followed the scores every week on the internet and managed the club to fame and glory on the computer game Championship Manager.

In September 1998 we made our first Brunton Park appearance. There were six of us who flew over for 8 - 9 days and made our first stop at Brunton Park, Carlisle. Before the game we strolled down to the club shop and basically emptied it for Carlisle Merchandise (and paid for it of course). Carlisle ended up losing the game to visitors Swansea, but still we had the time of our lives. There is no doubt that the reception the club and the people of Carlisle gave us that day made us even more devoted to following the club. We were introduced to the crowd and taken onto the pitch to do the half time draw. Standing out there on the middle of the field getting a big cheer from the home fans is by far one of my most memorable moments from my long career as a football fan.

We got our picture and a mention in both the News and Star and the match programme for the following home game.

After that amazing Brunton Park experience our devotion to

others about our great meeting with CUFC the number of Norwegian followers soon grew.

As of today we are a total of 36 members after an astonishing 13 new members just joined us from the Norwegian town of Flekkefjord. In addition to that we have one Honourable Member in Norway's legendary football commentator Arne Scheie, who can be described as the Norwegian equivalent to Britain's Andy Gray. After getting approval from CUOSC in Carlisle to become the supporters club's official Scandinavian Branch we have recently changed our name to Carlisle United Official Supporters Club - Scandinavian Branch.

We produce four issues of our fanzine *Cumbrian Norsemen* a year and send them to all our members. In addition we always look for opportunities to let both CUFC and our supporters club get better known among the Norwegian people. We have for instance donated a Carlisle home shirt to Tromso's number one football-pub and only this weekend we attended a 5-a-side amateur football tournament under the name of Carlisle United (see picture). The group of supporters in Flekkefjord call themselves Carlisle Blue Army and get together often to discuss football and have a good time.

Our next pilgrimage to Brunton Park will be around Easter and we hope to be quite a large bunch of Norsemen coming over. We look forward to see the lads play again and hopefully we'll get to have a chat with fellow supporters, players and others involved with the club.

A big COME ON CARLISLE cheer from the Norwegian delegation! The only way is UP! No worries! The glory days will soon be back!

Comments have been made regarding the price of admission to the LDV Vans Trophy games. After discussion the following suggestion was made by the Supporters Club in a letter to Paul Bell at Brunton Park. Kids for £1.00 and adults £10.00 or, and the preferred option:- Admission £5.00 for all.

Sadly neither option was accepted and the price of admission remained the same as for league games.

Another area of concern raised by yourselves is the condition of the toilets in the Warwick Road end of the ground. These concerns have been passed to Alan Steel for action.

Improved communication. We have suggested that posting boxes should be placed in and around the ground, which will be emptied after each game. In these you could place your suggestions for improvement, but let's keep these to 'realistic' improvements. These will then be forwarded to the appropriate person for consideration. If you include your details you will receive a reply.
