CCUIST - The Facts

Over the past few weeks' members of CCUIST will have received correspondence circulated by what appeared to be 'The Board of CCUIST'. With the exception of one letter informing the membership of a Special General Meeting, which was on CCUIST headed paper, this was not the case. Two letters sent in what appeared to be the name of the Trust and signed by Alan Steel were sent without the knowledge or authority of the full Trust board. Their contents were not discussed or agreed prior to circulation. The Board of CCUIST disclaims all responsibility for the unauthorised communications and apologises for the misuse of the CCUIST database. This will not happen in the future.

You will have read much about the proposal to CCUIST that we, the membership give consideration to relinquishing our option on the second 20% of shares, referred to in the Agreement with CUFC Holdings Limited as the First Option. All members of CCUIST will have received a letter from the board of CCUIST explaining the current situation at Carlisle United, together with a notice of a Special General Meeting to be held in Foxy's restaurant on Sunday 18 April at 11am, a proxy voting form for those who are unable to attend and copies of the two press releases from the board of CCUIST and on behalf of John Courtenay from the Club. Both were circulated to the media on 30/31 March.

Let's focus on the reality, the Club needs an injection of money, £500k will see our club financially viable for the start of the next season. I quote from the press release by John Courtenay "Since the purchase of the club almost two seasons ago, we have injected cash on an ongoing basis to make up the shortfall in costs and overheads. Particularly administration CVA and supervision, which cost £492,000 having been budgeted at £80,000. We have now reached a vital point in our redevelopment of the club but we need a cash injection of approximately £400k to clear the slate and leave only one restructured mortgage which should allow the club to stand alone and meet its overheads and costs going forward".

The board of CCUIST are constantly in talks with John Courtenay regarding the share issue and you can be assured that whilst having the best interests of the Trust in mind we will be realistic in what we hope to achieve and passionate in achieving it.

CCUIST have at this time the option of 49% of shares in CUFC Holdings Limited. This being available in three options, the first 20% followed by the second 20% and the last being the block of 9%. In reality we have only paid for 33.75% of the first 20% i.e. £135,000. We need to be pay a further £265,000 to secure the remainder of these shares before we could start on the second 20%. Our club needs money now and CCUIST just don't have it, that's the simple truth. 20%, 25.1%, 29% or 49% none would have overall control of the club 25.1% is achievable and give CCUIST a voice to be heard for years to come.

Our energies need to be put into raising the shortfall, then moving onto the last 9% or part thereof. Experience shows that to run a football club takes a great deal of money. Often requiring an injection of several thousand of pounds on a regular basis, that's reality. This is something CCUIST would not be able to do, certainly not in the short term and must work with others to give a secure future for our club.

The legalities for the purchase of shares in varying denominations are yet to be finalised. Anyone purchasing shares will be given the opportunity to leave the voting rights for these shares in the care of CCUIST. An option that can happen immediately or at a future date that decision is entirely up to the purchaser. Alternatively should the purchaser wish to sell their shares to the Holding Company who would then offer these shares to CCUIST in the first instance.

The board of CCUIST have often been called 'aloof' or 'distant'. I can assure you that in the future members of the board of CCUIST will be available, can be approached and your views will be taken seriously. Via this newsletter your concerns will be addressed and your questions answered. Those in the know told us that you normally receive a small percentage of tickets returned from the amount circulated. So we thought lets go for 6 - 8 thousand pounds which would be very nice. It was soon apparent that this amount would be exceeded. What has been really nice was some of the notes of encouragement which many members returned with their sold tickets. There was no competition to sell tickets, all sales were much appreciated and everyone selling or buying tickets have contributed to the success of this draw.

We asked for applications to be made by those wishing the money to be made available to their departments within Brunton Park or the money to be available for specific improvement. The successful application was made by Neil

Dalton who asked that the money raised by the draw to be made available to purchase TechnoGym equipment, which will be used by those requiring treatment under the supervision of the Physio department at Brunton Park. The equipment was to cost £12,000. A cheque for that amount has now been handed to Neil. It's hoped that delivery will be prior to our June Newsletter when you will be given an update with pictures of the equipment. The purchase of this equipment places Carlisle United in the position of being one of the best equipped physio departments in the 2nd and 3rd divisions of the Football League.

The remainder of the monies raised together with other money will be used to refurbish Foxy's Restaurant with audio and visual equipment, similar to that already supplied by The Supporters' Club in the Sunset Suite. The equipment in the Sunset Suite has proved very popular on match days and will establish the two function suites as desirable conference venues for the future.

Once again a huge thank you from the Supporters' Club you really are a fantastic bunch of supporters.

Carlisle Supporters Say a Sad Farewell to Bob Stokoe

THERE will be many memories of Bob Stokoe lifting the FA Cup with Sunderland in 1973 when they were victorious over Leeds United, but Carlisle supporters will remember Bob Stokoe as being in charge at Brunton Park for three separate spells 1968 - 70, 1980 - 85 and 1985 - 86.

No designer suits for Bob, he will always be remembered for his long raincoat and trilby hat, a quiet manner and determination under his management took Carlisle United to the semi-final of the League Cup in 1969. Bob left Carlisle United for a short time allowing Brian "Pop" Robson to take charge, but returned after only two months away. An honest, passionate, gentleman, however all that would change during a match he was a real winner. His players would walk through brick walls for him, although Bob would want them to run through the wall with a ball at their feet and then score at the other side.

Devasted by the death of his wife Jean from cancer a few years ago, his own health started to suffer from severe dementia in recent years. There have been a number of occasions when CCUIST and the Supporters' Club have invited him back to Carlisle but sadly his health was such that he was unable to travel, although he spoke very fondly of his time at the club. Bob Stokoe will be remembered at a number of clubs none more fondly than Carlisle United.

Gentle Giant of Carlisle United's Back Line Dies

Paddy Waters who lived at Scotby, Nr Carlisle died at the age of 82

Although a gentle giant off the field he was a tiger on it. Paddy Waters born in Dublin in 1922 the eldest of none children. His career started in Gaelic football and hurling and then moved onto amateur football with Bohemians. he gained his international cap for Ireland against Wales and in the summer of 1947 he came over the water to England. Preston North End was his first club and three happy years were spent at Deepdale playing alongside Tom Finney. Bill Shankley persuaded Paddy to move to Cumbria in 1950. He made 261 appearances for the Blues.

Rolling his shorts up he said made him run faster, it's not certain why he turned the collar of his shirt inside or decided not to wear any shin pads when playing.

Paddy was one of the Blues who played against Arsenal in the 1951 third round cup-tie when 57,000 packed into Highbury. After leaving Carlisle in 1958 he played for Gretna.

Remaining in Carlisle he was a well known face in the city.

Paddy loved golf and was a member at Brampton and Carlisle. He also ran for charity until the age of 69.

He is survived by his wife Doreen who he married in January 1954, and two sons Greg and Kevin.

Tribute to Geoff Twentyman

BORN in Brampton in 1930 Geoff started his playing career with Swifts Rovers in the Carlisle & District League before signing for Carlisle in 1947 under the management of Ivor Broadis.

Making his debut at Brunton Park in February 1947 he was described as a 'big skilful centre half or wing half who was good in the air'. 149 appearances later Liverpool FC signed him for £12,500.

It was as a result of this money that Carlisle United were able to re-build the main stand at Brunton Park after the original wooden structure burned down due to an electrical fault in 1953.

Geoff played 184 games for Liverpool from 1953 - 1959. After Liverpool he had a spell with Ballymena in the Irish League as player manager and returned to Carlisle United in 1963 and later clubs included Workington Red, Hartlepool and Morecambe. Geoff then managed Penrith FC for two seasons where he was an extremely popular personality.

Bill Shankley made a master stroke in 1967 when he offered Geoff the role of chief scout for Liverpool while he was the manager of Morecambe. From then on it was the greatest scouting success story ever known in British football. Geoff set up a scouting network which was an unbelievable success for two decades.

The list of players he discovered and recommended to first Bill Shankly, then Bob Paisley, Joe Fagan and Kenny Dalglish during his 20 years as head talent spotter reads like a Who's Who of Liverpool legends. To name some, many of who were signed on Geoff's recommendation alone read as follows:-

Kevin Keegan, John Toshack, Alec Lindsay, Terry McDermott, Phil Neal, Ray Clemence, Graeme Souness, Larry Lloyd, Steve Highway, David Fairclough, Alan Hansen, Alan Kennedy, Phil Thompson, Mark Lawrenson, Ian Rush, Steve Nichol, Paul Walsh, Peter Beardsley and John Barnes.

After all this success he never forgot his beloved Carlisle and regularly returned home to Brunton Park and Blackwell Racecourse. He always watched and followed CUFC's results with the utmost interest and always wished Carlisle United every success. When United were promoted in 1974 to Division One, Bill Shankly and Geoff Twentyman went on record in the national press stating "This was the greatest ever achievement by an English Football Club".

Many tributes have been passed by ex United players and colleagues including Bobby Johnston who recalls the ALL local half back line of Ginger Thompson, Geoff and himself. Bobby regarded Geoff as the best tackler in football an accolade that may agreed to be true.

Geoff Twentyman has been hailed as Carlisle United's greatest ever centre half.

In the last few years Geoff suffered from Alzheimer's disease. He is survived by his wife Pat (a Carlisle girl) and two sons Geoff and William and two daughters Susan and Margaret.

The Supporters' Organisations of Carlisle United send their most sincere condolences to Pat and her family. Geoff Twentyman will be missed but always remembered here in Carlisle.

Ruth a Footie Mad Grandma died 26.02.04



Ruth Bristo from Wigton was a true Blues fan for over 66 years. Supporting her beloved club from the age of 8 years, (it would have been earlier than that but her mother wouldn't allow her father to take her to the matches). Her first match being Carlisle v Accrington Stanley at Brunton Park.

Travelling all over the country to watch them and seldom missing a fixture, she was

Carlisle through and through until her sad death on 26 February.

Always to be found in the Paddock, more often than not with a radio stuck to her ear listening to scores from other grounds, or the result from her other love Manchester United) (well we are not all perfect!). You could always depend on her to tell you how our nearest rivals were doing, and the current position of CUFC. Ruth was always to be found in the same place in the Paddock. Standing gave her better elevation to shout at the teams, and shout she did not just at the opposition both teams would be offered advice as would the referee, officials and anyone else whom she thought would benefit from that advice. There was no hiding place if she thought you were wrong.

Ruth had soft spots for her favourites amongst these were Chris Balderstone, Ivor Broadis and Hughie McIlmoyle.

The Supporters' Club wish to express their most sincere condolences to Ruth's family and friends on her sudden and sad death. She is a true fan who will be sadly missed by everyone who knew her.

Gordon Titterington died March 2004

Along time supporters of Carlisle United and one of the founders of Titterington's Coaches has died. Gordon a well known face to both supporters and numerous teams of Carlisle United. Driving the team to football grounds around the country himself for many years before his sons took over the mantle. Wherever Carlisle United was to be found playing there was always a Titterington coach either transporting the supporter or the team. The team coach with its livery of jumping foxes was known throughout the country and was possibly one of the first to be adorned with a clubs trademark.

One only has to look back at some of the library photographs of Carlisle United to see a bull nosed Titterington coach in the background. They would be used to transport the players, manager and coach into the Lake District when the team went on one of Alan Ashman's walks up the fells (this was how he kept his team fit).

Our sympathy and that of the supporters of Carlisle United have been expressed to his wife and family.

To Romania with Love

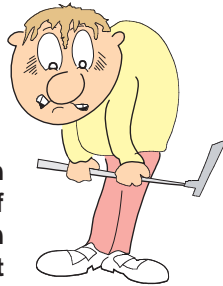
