### Brooks In Big Match

**L**ifelong Carlisle fan Brooks Mileson gave a huge vote of confidence to the Carlisle United Trust by donating £25,000 to the supporters appeal to buy a 25.1% stake in the club for the fans. The donation takes the fans trust well over the £200,000 mark in its quest to raise the just over £500,000 required. And in an even more remarkable move followed the donation with a promise to match any new donations to the Trust from 1st October 2004 pound for pound to help raise the rest of the £300,000 required.

Mr Mileson made the offer following a number of recent meetings with the Trust board and hopes that his offer will galvanise fans and the community alike into quickly raising the required money.

Commenting on the agreement Mileson said:



*"Everyone knows of my feelings for Carlisle United and as a fan I feel that this opportunity should not be missed. The United Trust has done very good work to re-establish its aims and objectives recently and there are a number of excellent fundraising initiatives already in place.*

*John Courtenay and now Fred Story have put a mechanism in place for the fans and members of the community to buy a share in United and I want people to see this for the opportunity it is and raise the money - we won't get another chance".*

*"What I am saying is if you put your money in I'll match it whether you're an individual putting in a pound or a company making a large donation. The club will really benefit from the cash injection from any money put in for shares and this will do a huge amount of good in the short term - and will go a long way to helping Fred and Paul Simpson in their quest to get the team back on the road to where it belongs - in the football league".*

**Kate Rowley, Chair of the United Trust, added:**

*"This is a magnificent gesture by Brooks and we are delighted that he has shown his support for what we are trying to do in such a generous fashion. We want to support Fred Story, Paul Simpson and the directors and players of Carlisle United by making good on our side of the share deal as quickly as possible and this will be a massive help".* The pledge by Brooks will match all monies coming into the Trust's share fund from 1st October 2004. This means that existing contributors will have their standing orders matched from this date; all new contributions, standing orders and donations will be matched and all income from fundraising events such as the forthcoming sportsman's dinner featuring Franco Baresi and Bryan Robson will also receive matched funding.

## Annual Report of the Committee of the Carlisle United Official Supporters' Club - October 2004

### Your committee has met on 10 occasions since our last Annual General Meeting.

In excess of 30k has been made available by way of donation and sponsorship to Carlisle United Football Club.

Members of the Supporters' Club have assisted the club when requested to do so with the sale of tickets and the distribution of the Season Tickets.

In conjunction with The United Trust our newsletter has been produced every second month for the past year. The decision has been taken that the Newsletter will in future be produced 4 times a year. This decision purely down to cost.

The second Annual Awards Ceremony held in the Shepherds Inn, Carlisle was well supported, the main player awards going to Kevin Gray and Brendan McGill. This season's ceremony will be held on 1 May 2005, put this date in your diary.

Your committee decided not to increase the cost of membership this year, which we are sure, you will agree is more than generous at £5 and £10 per year.

The Junior Blues goes from strength to strength, their Christmas party is in the planning stage and one not to be missed. Each JB will be sent a birthday card, which we are sure, will prove popular.

The web continues to be an excellent source of information. The CUOSC on line site continues to be popular with the fans and very informative. Together with the club site and the message board your committee is kept up to date with the views of the supporters.

The schools football tournament at the end of last season was well supported by local schools and attracts some of the smaller schools from the surrounding areas outside the City.

The Grand Draw earlier in the year raised £13,000, which was magnificent. The credit for this success goes to all those who sold tickets, collected and donated prizes.

There is now a Lancashire Branch of the Supporters' Club, which is looked after by Barry Stephenson.

Consideration has been given to moving the popular Fans Forum from location to location, however, because of the involvement of Radio Cumbria and their staff providing a service the Forums will remain at Brunton Park. Your committee is grateful to BBC Radio Cumbria for their transmission of the Forum and their involvement at no cost. Questions have been sent from all over the world. The next Forum will be held on Tuesday 18 January.

Crests on the Warwick Road End - you will have noticed (unless you stand in the Warwick Road End) the two crests that were put up prior to the start of the season, one is the logo of the Supporters' Club the other the new crest of the United Trust. This gives the message that the club and supporters are working together for the good of CUFC. Sadly, Border Television continue to show an old picture of the Warwick Road End of Brunton Park, lets see how long it takes them to get themselves down to Brunton Park and take a new photograph for their sports programme.

Sadly, discount in the Blue Store was cut to 5% at the beginning of the season, this was without consultation with the committee of the Supporters' Club and caused a great deal of concern, that concern was expressed to the commercial management team who apologised for not consulting prior to the change.

A quiz night is scheduled for Thursday 18 November. This will take place in the Sunset Suite and details can be found in this newsletter.

Travel - A Supporters' Club coach visited all away matches last season, this season we will be doing the same - a huge thank you for supporting us. The annual weekend away will be for the Farnborough v Carlisle match in April 2005 - for more information see the advert contained in this newsletter.

Player sponsorship - the supporters' club has sponsored home and away strips for Brendan McGill and away strip for Kevin Gray, Bobs Bargains - available on away travel, sponsor Tom Cowan. The Junior Blues sponsor Olga the fox. All money going into the club.

Platinum Suite - concerns were expressed by our fans that away supporters had been placed into the Platinum stand, which is in essence a family stand. Bad language and inappropriate behaviour was displayed by some of the visiting fans, which is unacceptable. After representation we have been reassured that the Waterworks End will be used in future or the East Stand should the visiting fans warrant it.

When Knighton went so did much of our history in either picture or press coverage. What we would like is to try and compile some items relevant to Carlisle United's history whether in picture, programme or any type of memorabilia that would be beneficial to a museum at Brunton Park. Where possible we will have your precious memories copied and the originals returned to you. Tullie House are keen to display some items and are willing to advise and collate items for us. The following morning the four of us walked down to the stadium and had a bit of a spending spree in the club shop before we went into the stadium to look for our contact, Kate Rowley. I was very excited to finally met the people I've only had contact with via e-mails.

We went over the the paddock ticket office where a smiling woman leaned out of the window. The smiling lady turned out to be Kate and after giving us free tickets to the Paddock she led us into the Sunset Suite inside the stadium. We grabbed our pints and sat down at a table all thrilled by the fact that we soon would be joined by the real Carlisle-born fans. We were there fairly early which gave us plenty of time to place or bets on the match. (our optimistic predictions for a high-scoring game saw us with no winnings after the match, however, we were all pleased as punch with the important 1-0 win.) Shortly we were joined by the lads from the supporters club. The friendly bunch introduced themselves and sat down with us. It didn't take long before we had the obligatory exchange, odd swear-words from our respective languages, as Phil was very eager to learn some colourful phrases to shout at the Danish Harriers boss, Jan Molby.

We were all sitting at the table chatting along as if we'd known each other from birth, and it is a moment that will stick to my footballing mind forever. I must say we were welcomed in the best possible way by our newfound Carlisle friends.

Players come and go, but the fans are always the same and will always be there. This fact is very important for us as a foreign branch of Carlisle supporters. To have close contact with the United supporters in Carlisle is vital for our existence as the Norwegian Branch of Carlisle fans. Every football club is made by its fans, and being a part of Carlisle United makes me very proud.

When kick-off approached we all headed for the Paddock end. We were introduced to other fans surrounding us in the Paddock and soon the ref blew his whistle indicating the start of the game. I remember thinking to myself that this surely was something else than listening to the matches over the internet. I soon saw the different qualities in each of the players, and was especially impressed with the performacne from Simmo himself alongside McGill and Andrews. "There is no way this side is going down", I said to myself as I watched them perform on the pitch. Phil was already busy shouting his

Danish phrases towards the Kidderminster dug-out, to everyones amusement. I remember at one point when Phil left for the toilet, a guy three rows below me turned round and said: "Have I gone deaf or has Phil gone to take a p.....?".

At half time Robbo, Phil, Leo, Pal and I were led onto the pitch, while Kim-Freddy was busy taking photographs of the event for our Scandinavian Branch fanzine, *Cumbrian Norsemen*. Robbo and Phil handed over a cheque while I was honoured to pick the half time draw winning number. I made one guy very happy when I drew his number. He promised to buy us foreigners a beer later on in the pubs, but unfortunately I can't remember how much money I won him, or if he ever came round to buying us those pints.

After the good 1-0 win we celebrated with a couple of pints in the crowded Sunset Suite before we headed off across the road the famous Beehive, for more beers and more laughs with the friendly, and happy people of Carlisle. We were introduced to even more friendly and passionate United followers and by the time we went back to our guesthouse we must have met and chatted to every Carlisle fan in the city that night. Superb!

The following morning Kim-Freddy and I went to the Orient game in London, while Pal and Leo stayed in Carlisle to do some sight-seeing before they flew back home from Newcastle. The Carlisle supporters coach left for London at 6am! from Brunton Park and it took us a good six hours to get to the ground at Orient. Fortunately, as we both live in Northern Norway with huge distances, a mere six hours in a coach was like a walk in the park for us.

The atmosphere at the Orient game was fantastic. Well at least in the Carlisle end it was. Our end was packed with Blues who were singing and chanting for 90 minutes non-stop, while the home crowd simply sat in their seats and seemed to be enjoying a quiet day out in the sun. The game was very intense and well played by our lads. Carlisle fought bravely against a dirty playing Orient side, but as long as the referee allowed Orient to keep up their filthy play and mindless tackles there was nothing we could do about it. The game ended 1-1, leaving us with another point in the struggle for survival.

After the game we said our goodbyes to our friends and headed out to Stansted for our flight back home. Pennyless, but full of great memories from a top class Carlisle - stay!

I speak for everyone in the Norse delegation when I say that we had the time of our lives together with the ever so friendly people of Carlisle.

We'll be back! - every season!

## To Romania with Love

**I**t took a year of planning, a lot of hard work and many generous people and Businesses donating goods to take with us to Romania. But the time had finally come for us to leave Carlisle and start on our 4 day journey across Europe to reach our destination of Bucharest, Romania, passing through Holland, Germany, Austria, Hungary and finally through Romania. The team of 10 included Salvationists from Carlisle Temple Corps, Church of England members from Kendal, Jim (Our main driver) from Gainsborough and Jacob our new friend from Holland who assisted Jim in the driving. We left Carlisle on Wednesday 15th September with a 7.5 tonne wagon and a large jumbulance full to capacity of aid and equipment for the trip.

Part of our load was a supply of new CUFC T shirts (all sizes, all ages) kindly donated by Carlisle United Football Club and other goods donated by members of the Carlisle United Supporters Club and Carlisle United Trust. Upon arrival in Bucharest one of our first visits was to a home for children who suffer from HIV and Aids, 7 children in total ageing from 18 months to 16 years, boys and girls. It was our pleasure to supply these children with T shirts and tell them a little about our local football team (two members of our team are season ticket holders) and what fun it was trying them on and posing for photos to show back home, the children thought Christmas had come early for them. The remainder of the T shirts will be distributed by Light into Europe, the charity which invited us out there, to the children who attend the school where we were based.

The main reason we were invited to Bucharest was to decorate, carpet and furnish a Kindergarten for children age 3-5 years who are totally blind. We spent three days at the school where many partially sighted and blind children attend. It was a very enjoyable time, but also a very humbling experience for the whole team. These children have nothing, yet they are very happy and they give of their love so easily. In between the jobs we had to do, many of the team members had time to spend with the children, talking and playing sports with them, we didn't need an interpreter their actions spoke more than words could say.

Too soon our trip was coming to an end and time to say goodbye to our new found friends, we had 5 days travelling ahead of us to reach home. But we have all returned home with fond and happy memories of the children we met and how they have all touched our hearts. Perhaps our outlook on life has changed through our experiences and I know it has strengthened our faith and our commitment to continue to support those children in Romania.

It just leaves to me to sincerely say a big thank you to all those who supported the team, financially, in prayer and with goods to take with us, without you our trip would have been fruitless.

## Kate Rowley - United Trust Main Board Representative

**H**aving taken over from Alan Steel as the Trust main board representative at the beginning of the season I have now attended three Board meetings at Brunton Park. As promised here is a flavour of some of the business that has crossed the boardroom table.

Since the take over by Fred Story things have been hectic and much work has been done, with much of this being on a purely voluntary basis. Everyone seems to want to help in any way they can for the benefit of the club.

It was imperative that the financial side of the operation was one of the first areas to be addressed and here, along with the commercial side much work has been done to bring much needed funding into the club. Everyone has worked tirelessly in encouraging business and the community to invest in the club and its future.

There are still areas of operational management that we wish to change or improve upon and this vital area will now be under the control of the new Operations Manager and I feel sure that he will bring his own style of management in making a success of this important role. Much energy and resources has been directed towards stabilising costs and clearing outstanding debts owed by the club.

The playing side received a boost due to very kind support from Brooks Milesen and other sponsorship deals have been successfully negotiated by the club. On top of these donations and sponsorship deals there is also the money paid into the club from the United Trust in respect of the shares purchased by them.

You will appreciate that much of the work and information discussed in the boardroom is confidential and it is not my intention to disclose sensitive items. But where supporters have asked questions and the replies effect the supporter in general I will report back to you.

Some of these concerns are around ticketing issues and areas of the ground where away fans have been located. At your request I made representation regarding the two tier pricing system for the LDV Vans trophy 1st round held at Brunton Park. It was agreed that there would be one price for adult and junior concessions dependent on the part of the ground being used, for future games.

I have also received a number of complaints regarding the lack of tickets for the East Stand and Warwick Road areas of the ground for the Barnet Game, this meant that

the East Stand ticket office had to close at 2.30pm and the Warwick Road at 2.45pm having both run out of tickets. The Paddock was down to its last book before it closed after kick off. Apologies for all those who went to either the East Stand or Warwick Road offices to then be told that they would have to go round to the Paddock office if they wanted in. Next season ticket sales will revert to the turnstiles prior to that staff will have to be employed so if there is anyone out there who sees themselves as turnstile operators then watch out for the adverts in the programme.

Representation was made after supporters in the Platinum suite aired concerns about away supporters being seated in that area. Away fans will be now be located in the Waterworks End or the East Stand dependent on the size of their support. To those fans that spoke to me about the situation thank you for being so understanding.

The agreement made by Michael Knighton with Newcastle United Football Club regarding the Super 7's lottery has been given 6 months notice of termination as required by that agreement and a new Blues Lotto is now underway.

Sadly the last forum had to be cancelled but forums are always a good sounding board for communicating with supporters. If anyone wants to speak to me or express a concern or complement in the meantime I can be found in the Paddock Ticket Office on match days. The next forum will be on 18th January in the Sunset Suite.

Your United Trust gave another £27k to the club this month and the Supporters' Club continue to give their support for whatever benefits the club and the supporter. If you are not currently supporting the Trust please give it your consideration and help us to raise the money required to give us the fans a real stake in the club.
